

Bass Furniture Sold To Ithaca Bike Shop

Babe Shulman has sold the Bass Furniture building, 120 W. State St., to Ralph Button of the Ithaca Bike Shop.

Shulman is in the process of looking for a suitable location for his furniture store. He is negotiating for three different spots, and if that does not work

satisfactorily, he plans to build a new store.

He wants a place that allows easy parking and night shopping, which probably means, he said, somewhere in the northeast part of town.

Button said he plans to move the Ithaca Bike Shop from its

present location at 530 W. State St. to the Bass building, which will provide a larger showroom and storage area.

Button said this will enable him to expand all lines of bikes and accept more repair jobs. Owning a larger storage area, Button said, means that he can order larger shipments of bicycles, which he said may lower the prices for both himself and the customer.

Button said he will be taking possession of the new store Oct. 1, and hopes to move in by Nov. 1.

His grand opening, planned for Nov. 17-18, will feature representatives from his suppliers, and the eight-time National British sprint champion and two-time Olympic contestant, Karl Barton.

Button moved his shop two years ago in order to expand his storage area, and now finds that he must increase the space again — a reflection he said, of the ever-increasing popularity of bike riding.
